## Topic Overview

Our topic 'Singing in the Rain' will give us the opportunity to explore the seasons and changing weather of the UK. We will also develop some geography skills through finding out about different climates around the world and how these differences have an effect on the land and people.

The topic of 'Singing in the Rain' is a lovely opportunity to explore words and language through rhyme and poetry. Weather vocabulary will be used in story writing, non fiction writing and recounts.

We will use different types of weather as the starting point for art activities using a range of paints, pastels, crayons and collage materials.

We will explore the use of different materials for our science focus this term. We will talk about types of material, their properties and the reasons they are used for different purposes.

What's the weather like this week?



## Literacy Overviews
