Year 1 Autumn Term 'Home Sweet Home'

Topic Overview

The Year 1 topic this half term is Home Sweet Home.' This is primarily a geography topic, however our topic will also be incorporated into our art, history and literacy too.

We will initially learn about different types of houses and different types of families. We will then explore our local community and recognise local amenities on a basic map. Next, children will study London landmarks and their history. After this the children will learn about the UK by naming and locating England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland. As well as naming their capital cities.

Many of our class texts will relate nicely to our topic, including the stories, "The Three Little Pigs,' 'And Tango Makes Three' and lots of information texts (non-fiction).

What's your favourite colour? How many diamonds are in your crown? What is your favourite food? How old are you? How many dogs do you have? What type of dogs are they?




Places to Visit

Literacy Overview

This term we will do much of our literacy work from different class texts each week. We will be writing stories, poems, traditional tales, information text and instructions.

Our grammar work will focus using our phonic knowledge and known high frequency words to write sentences independently. We will look at capital letters and full stops to complete sentences correctly.

In phonics we will be learning a new sound each day and there will be a larger focus on reading high frequency words.



Maths Overview

Each week in the 'What we are doing in class' newsletter details of the objectives to be covered will be given. This term we will be practising counting to twenty and representing these numbers in different ways using tens and ones. Children will then move on to being introduced to addition and subtraction and become familiar with using ten frames, part whole models and bar models. Then the children will name and sort 2D and 3D shapes.
