Build it	Design it	Play it
This week we will be focussing on shapes!  Can you make a 'shape monster'? Using cardboard boxes, paper or junk modelling materials can you make or draw a shape monster adding different features? How many eyes/legs/arms etc will your monster have? What colour will your monster be? Will it have fur, hair or antenna? Will it be big or small? Can you describe your monster?  Remember to include a mouth so you can 'feed' your monster different shapes! Can you pretend that your shape monster is hungry! Using paper shapes can you feed your monster? How many shapes will your monster eat? What shape did your monster like eating the most?	Using different shapes, can you draw different objects or people? Can you make a rocket? Can you make a house? Can you make your family? What other objects can you create? What shapes will you use and how will you arrange them? (You can make shape templates using cardboard and draw around these or draw your own.)  What shapes have I used to create My rocket?	Pretend that your shape monster has visited you from another planet!  Can you dress up like a monster using any materials from home?  Can you dress up someone in your family as a monster too?  What are your monster names?  Can you talk about your monster worlds and describe them to each other? What kind of foods do you like to eat?

Read it	Write it	Find it
Can you find some traditional stories in your home? (Jack and the beanstalk, Cinderella, Goldilocks and the three bears, little red riding hood, the three little pigs, the gingerbread man etc) can you read these stories this week and think about which one is your favourite? What characters did you like the best? Does your family have a traditional story from your family or culture? Can they tell you the story? Can you remember what happened?	Can you make up a story about your monster? Can you describe how your monster arrived on earth? What planet does the monster come from? What does it look like? How does the monster feel about being away from its planet? What does it like about earth? Can you draw the planet that your monster lives on? Is it a different shape? Is it big/small? What colour is it? What does it look like?	Can you become a shape detective? Please look around your home and find circles, squares, triangles and rectangles. Can you sort and order these in to sets of shapes? What items have you found? What shape did you find the most of? Can you count the circles, rectangles, triangles and squares that you find?

You can also practise writing a S sound, starting at the top of your page. Can you make a slithery S shape? As you write, you can say the poem "Slither down the snake" Can you make the S sound? Can you make some big S shapes in the air too?
