Maths

Information for Parents:

This week we will be focusing on number and place value.

Children in year 2 should be able to count in steps of 1, 2, 3, 5 and 10 forwards and backwards so this is something that you can support them with.

Looking at place value, the children should understand for example that 34 can be broken in 3 tens and 4 units and 27 is 2 tens and 7 units. They can draw these as ten sticks and ones if this helps them.

 $34 = || ||_{00}^{00} \text{ so } 30 + 4 = 34$

They can then use this to compare numbers using crocodile symbols < > A helpful tip is to remember that the crocodile always wants to eat the bigger number. So 34 < 56 but 71 > 23.

We then use these skills to add by partitioning into tens and units.

23 +56, 20 + 50 = 70 and 3 + 6 = 9 70 + 9 = 79 so 23 +56 = 79


