Research it...	Draw it...	Play it...
<p>We have looked at which countries our families come from but this week we are going to talk about who is in our family. Talk to your parents about your families. You know that your grandparents are your Mummy and Daddy's parents but who are your Great Grandparents? Do your Mummy and Daddy have brothers and sisters? See if you can research who is in your family. How many family members can you write down?</p>	<p>Using your research of people in your family can you draw a family tree? You could draw a tree and then a leaf for each family member and write their name in it. You might chose to paint your tree or use finger prints for the leaves. You could stick pictures of your family on it too.</p> <p>How many names can you get on your tree?</p> <p>Some examples are shown below.</p> 	<p>This week you are going to play a Scavenger Hunt! Using your wonderful descriptive clues can you read them to an adult and see if they can find the item. Give your grown up a time limit to find each item! You can make it more difficult for them by giving them less time to find each item! Can your parents write some too to see if you can solve the clue!?</p> <p>Parents we will let you negotiate how long you will need to find each item!</p>

<p>This week we are going to look at a few more of our everyday words. Can you practice writing these ones? <i>are, out, have, but, he, then, with</i></p> <p>You could come up with a sentence for each word – try and make it exciting e.g. <i>/have hands as big as a car.</i> You could write these words on post-it notes and stick them on your toys so that you see them every day!</p>	<p>This week you are going to write clues for a scavenger hunt to play at home. Clues are words used to help find the answer to something. You can use describing words to explain what something is without naming the object. An example might be 'You wear me on your feet, I am soft, I go inside your shoe.' Yes it's a sock!</p> <p>Can you write 5 clues for different items found in your home? Try to use your best descriptive words!</p>	<p>Each week we will be creating a maths PowerPoint that will support your child's learning. These will be emailed separately. This week's learning is about odd and even numbers. There are 5 days of lessons to complete. It is important to read through the slides to familiarise yourself with the learning before you work through it with your child.</p>
