
Day 4: What do you remember?

LO: I can compare weight using scales

There are lots of different types of scales we can use to measure weight but they all tell us the same thing, how heavy something is....



These scales look a bit like a clock. The hand goes round as weight gets added to the bowl. The further the hand goes round the heavier something is.

Look at the hands on these sets of scales. Which one do you think is heavier? Why?





Some scales are electric.





As weight gets added to the scales the number goes up. The bigger the number the more something weighs!

Which of these weighed items has the biggest number, the apple or the strawberries? What does that mean?





Let's look at your predictions from yesterday.



You may have some scales at home. See if you can weigh the items you compared yesterday. Were your predictions correct? Which item was the heaviest and which was the lightest?
