Build it...	Design it...	Play it...
<p>This week our story is Cinderella.</p> <p>Can you create a carriage for Cinderella to get to the ball? You can use any materials you would like (construction, cardboard boxes, building bricks etc) What magical features will you include in your carriage? How will it move? Will it have magical flying features?</p> <p>Oh no! The carriage has broken down on the way to the ball! Can you make a new vehicle to help get Cinderella to the ball? What do you think will be the best way to get Cinderella to the ball on time? Will your vehicle drive? Fly? Go on land or sea?</p> <p>Can you create a castle for the Prince to live in? How big will your castle be? Will it have a draw bridge? What about some windows? What special features do castles have? You could even make a castle den! Using material at home, can you create a special den? Will you put some special cushions inside to make it comfy?</p>	<p>Can you design your own crown to wear to the ball? Be as creative as you can and add some materials if you have some at home to make your crown sparkle and shine. You could add sweet wrappers, foil, fingerprints dipped in paint, pens etc...</p> <p>If you go out for a walk this week can you find different sized twigs? You could take these home and then create your own magic wands! You could paint them and make them beautiful colours. You could add strips of foil or material to the ends to make them look really special. You could even stick some leaves on and make magic wands using only the natural materials that you can find. Can you also make some decorations and decorate your home and transform it into a palace for the ball? You can use any materials you have at home. You could make paper chains, streamers or pictures to hang up. Can you listen to some music and create a painting or a drawing while you are listening to it? How does the music make you feel?</p>	<p>Can you make your own magic spells? The fairy Godmother made a spell and turned Cinderella's rags into a beautiful ball gown. She also turned a pumpkin into a carriage! What magic spell would you like to make? Can you think of any rhyming words to use in your spell?</p> <p>If you could make a magic spell, would you make your favourite story character a real friend or make one of your toys come to life? What would you like to do? If the Fairy Godmother visited you, what would you like her to do with her magic? Different clothes? A type of transport? A palace to live in? Or something else?</p> <p>You could make some cakes with a grown up to have at your ball. Help to choose the cakes with your grown up and see if you have the ingredients. Can you help to weigh the ingredients, stir the mixture? Remember not to touch the hot oven!</p> <p>You could also make some pretend playdough food to have at your ball too. Can you manipulate the dough to create different shapes for the food? 		<p>Discuss the behaviour of the two sisters and the stepmother with a grown up. How do you think Cinderella would have felt? How could the sisters and the stepmother have been more friendly and kind to Cinderella?</p> <p>Have a ball at home! Enjoy the food you have made, appreciate the decorations, wear your crown, and most importantly have fun with your family! (Don't forget to give out your invitations first!)</p> <p>Listen to some ball music and invent a ball dance with someone in your family. (You can find music links above.)</p> <p>Can you create some different ball dance moves for the different music?</p> <p>You could also make your own music using your own instruments! You could try and use things that makes sounds from around your home, like crisp packets, keys, a squeaky toy, coins in a pot or even your body!</p> <p>After you have explored the different sounds, try making a noise maker! Place different items in a bag or box and use the different objects for others to guess and identify.</p>

<p>Can you read the story of Cinderella? I have included a PowerPoint version of the story for you to read with your child if you do not have the book at home. (Once open click on 'slide show', then 'from beginning' and then press the 'enter' or 'space bar' key to access each slide.) You can access some phonics games on Twinkl go this week. There are some sound discrimination games and there is also a more challenging game, matching initial sounds to pictures if you would like to try. There are different stages of challenge and you can play the games as much as you like to reinforce and practise the sounds. Click on sign in and use the code <b>HP4056</b></p> <p>Don't forget there are lots of free books and stories that you can access using the links below. You will need to create an account, but the books and stories are free once you have done this. What details do you need to include? (Who are you inviting? Where is the ball taking place? What time does it start? What day will the ball take place?) You can make it as fancy as you like. Maybe you could draw the castle/palace or the prince on the front of your invitation?</p> <p>We have practised the sounds <b>S,a,t,p</b> so far.</p> <p>Can you practise the letter <b>i</b> this week?</p> <p>Can you make the letter shape for <b>i</b>? i is for insect. As you try it you can say the poem....'Down the body and dot for the head.'</p> <p>Below is a video to help make the correct sounds for each letter if you are not sure. Please don't worry about doing all of them (there are many!) You can just practise the letters we have looked at from the previous weeks. <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=-ksblMiliA8">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=-ksblMiliA8</a></p> <p>Have another go at writing the letters you have already practised too! Please continue to practise writing your name too.</p>	<p>Discuss telling the time using a clock. You could make 'O' clock times for the children to practise. Can you recognise any numbers on the clock? Using a timer on a phone with a grown up, can you see how many jumps, claps, hops, star jumps etc you can do in 30 seconds/ 1 minute? Can you do more in 30 seconds or 1 minute? Why do you think that is? Does the amount change if you do them fast or slow? Why?</p> <p>You could have a go at making a clock face this week! Can you identify the numbers? Can you put them in the right order? Can you use the hands to make 12 o'clock? Can you make any different o'clock times? (I have attached a template if you need one.) You could also try and measure different shoes and feet this week. Who has the biggest shoes in your home? Who has the smallest shoes? Who has the biggest feet? Who has the smallest?</p>
