



## Writing

- As our topic on 'here comes the sun' continues, we have a new book which is set on the coast. This week we will be reading 'The Storm Whale' by Benji Davies.
- Here is a link to a youtube video of the book being read, for the children to watch before doing the following tasks <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=czczPkmP988>
- This is a story of a boy who finds a whale washed up on the shore. He takes it home and tries to become friends with the whale. When the boy's father finds the whale he explains that they should take it back home to the sea.
- The children can retell the story in their own words.
- In class, before we retell a story, we often draw a Talk 4 Writing story map where we use pictures to represent the sentences.

##### What to include:

- Introduce the characters and where they lived
- Describe the storm
- What did Noi find washed up on the beach?

#### To retell the middle of the story

##### What to include:

- Noi taking the whale home and putting it in the bath

<b>Task 3</b>	<p><b><u>To retell the ending of the story</u></b></p> <p><b>What to include:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Dad finding the whale (why wasn't he angry?)</li> <li>• Taking the whale back to sea</li> <li>• How did Noi feel?</li> <li>• Noi still being able to see the whale and wave</li> </ul>

<b>Learn:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• This week we will be focussing on synonyms</li> <li>• Synonyms are words that have a similar meaning</li> <li>• In Year 1, children are encouraged to use these to broaden their vocabulary in both their speech and their writing</li> </ul>

## Phonics

- I start every phonics lesson by showing the children phase 3 (purple) or 5 (pink) flashcards and then they say the sound.
- I will then show them the sound we are learning that day and they write it.
- I then model how it sounds and they repeat.
- We will then try and use that sound to spell three different words. To do this segment the word, count the sounds on your fingers and attempt to write
- Finally we will read three words that contain that sound. To do this segment each sound then blend it.
