<p>Can you use natural materials eg, sticks, leaves, fir cones, mud to build your very own minibeast hotel? You could build it at your local park and then check it whenever you visit and see if it has attracted any visitors!</p> <p>Some examples are shown below...</p> <div></div>	<p>Imagine you are an explorer. You have lifted a big rock and underneath there are lots of minibeasts! There is a brand new minibeast which has never been seen before! What does it look like? Does it have legs? How many? What shape is it? What colour is it? See if you can draw or paint a picture of your new discovery! Once you have finished your picture can you label it or write a few sentences about your new minibeast?</p>	<p>There are lots of sounds which we can hear just walking down the street. What do you think you might hear? Stand in an outdoor space and listen to what sounds you can hear around you. Were you right? Who can hear the most sounds?</p> <p>Ask a grown up to make a list of the sounds that you hear. When you get home listen again to the sounds around you. Can you hear different sounds inside?</p>															
Read it...	Write it...	Learn it...															
<p>We are going to look again at sounds that have more than one spelling. The sound ai, as in rain can also be written as ay (play, stay) a (apron) ea (great) and a-e (snake), which we call a split spelling. Can you sort these words into the headings?
