How does a butterfly become a butterfly? Can you research the life cycle of a butterfly and draw the different stages? Think of different ways of doing your research. You could use a computer, books or television shows. See if there is anything you can cut out and stick to help you create your own butterfly life

Can you create your very own egg box caterpillar? Paint your egg box in a colour of your choice and leave to dry. Once dry cut out each compartment and arrange into your caterpillar formation. You could give it eyes and antenna! See examples below.






Play it... Butterflies are symmetrical. This means they are exactly the same on

both sides. If you hold a mirror up you will see your reflection. If you wave in the mirror your reflection makes the exact same motion.

With an adult see if you can mirror each other's movements. See how long you can keep going until one of you laughs!

Learn it....

We are going to look at some more every day words. Can you have a go at reading these words, writing them and using them in a sentence? Can you write some of these sentences down and see if you can remember how to spell each of the words below.



Can you write your very own nursery rhyme? Using 'Baa baa black sheep' as your tune can you change the animal and the noise it makes? Think carefully about the animal and the noise they make! See the example below. *Moo moo brown cow have you any milk?*
