Maths	
Information for Parents:	
As these are the last two weeks of Year 1, we will be recapping on a different area of maths each day	
This is a suggested break down of a lesson per day but it is up to you when they are completed in the week.	
Monday	Today the focus will be on number and place value Children to complete the online task on mymaths - number and place value OW
Tuesday	Today the focus will be on counting Children to complete the online task on mymaths - counting OW
Wednesday	Today the focus will be on number bonds Children to complete the online task on mymaths - number facts OW

Thursday	Today the focus will be on addition and subtraction Children to complete the online task on mymaths - addition and subtraction OW
Friday	Today the focus will be on multiplication and division Children to complete the online task on mymaths - multiplication and division OW

Task 1

To write about what you do when you feel wild

At the beginning of this story, the little boy gets in trouble for getting up to mischief when he feels wild. This is a nice opportunity to discuss with children that we all feel wild at times and get them to think about what mischief they get up to when they feel wild. What happens to them when they get up to too much mischief?



When I feel Wild...
 I jump on the bed.
 I run in the house.
 I scream and act crazy.
 I stomp my feet.
 I climb on poles.
 I run around crazy like Mario.
 I play fight with my brother.
 I pitch a fit.
 I swing really high.

Task 2

To write a setting description

The children can start by 'One night a forest grew in Max's room.' They can use a range of adjectives to describe the forest. What adjectives can be used to describe the trees? What happened to the floor? What did the sky look like?

Task 3

To write a character description

Look at pictures of the wild things, what can you see? We are going to describe their eyes, paws and teeth. Think of adjectives/similes to describe each of these. Then think what each of these are doing and where/when/why they are doing it. Then write a sentence for each.

Who / What	What	When, where Why

The razor sharp teeth	are gleaming	during the wild rumpus.

Science

This term we are learning all about plants. At home the children can do the following activities:

- Label parts of a flowering plant and tree (leaves, flowers (blossom), petals, fruit, roots, bulb, seed, trunk, branches, stem)
- Label parts of a tree
- The children should become familiar with the names of common plants
- Understand some trees are deciduous and some are evergreen
- They can plant a plant of their choice and observe how it changes over time
- Understand what a flower needs to grow
