#### Maths

#### Information for Parents:

- This week, we will be focussing on time
- The children will just be gaining an understanding of the concept of time
- We will be sequencing events, learning the days and the months

This is a suggested break down of a lesson per day but it is up to you when they are completed in the week.

## Monday

Today the focus will be on sequencing events.

## Writing


Our topic is now plants, so many of the books and the writing we will do will be based on that.

This week we will be reading 'Oliver's Vegetables' by Vivian French.

This also links well with our maths work on days of the week.

#### Task 1

## To retell the beginning of the story

Children can retell the beginning of the story which can include:

- On Monday Oliver went to grandpa's house
- Oliver wanted chips
- Grandpa said he had to find the potatoes but if he found something else he had to eat it
- Oliver pulled some leaves but they were carrots (could use an adverb to describe how Oliver ran round the garden)
- Oliver ate the carrots for lunch (could use an adjective to describe carrots)

# Task 2 To retell the middle of the story

Children can tell the middle of the story which can include:

- On Tuesday Oliver found CRINKLY leaves but they were spinach so they
  had spinach for supper (can use adjective to describe spinach)
- On Wednesday Oliver found leaves but they were rhubarb so they ate rhubarb pie (can use adjective to describe rhubarb)
- On Thursday Oliver found cabbage and ate two helpings (can use adjective to describe cabbage)

# Task 3 To retell the ending of the story

Children can retell the ending of the story which can include:


- On Friday Oliver found some beetroot so he ate beetroot salad (can use adjective to describe beetroot)
- On Saturday Oliver found peas so he ate pea soup in the evening
- On Sunday Oliver found the potatoes
- They used the potatoes to make chips (use adjective to describe chips)

## Phonics & Spelling

### **Phonics**

- The children have now covered all of their sounds from phase 2-5.
- They will still need to practise these sounds daily, so I have attached phase 3 and 5 sound mats below.

#### Science

This term we are learning all about plants. At home the children can do the following activities:

- Label parts of a flowering plant and tree (leaves, flowers (blossom), petals, fruit, roots, bulb, seed, trunk, branches, stem)
- Label parts of a tree
- The children should become familiar with the names of common plants
- Understand some trees are deciduous and some are evergreen
- They can plant a plant of their choice and observe how it changes over time
- Understand what a flower needs to grow
