Maths

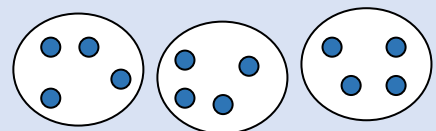
Information for Parents:

This week we will be focusing on sharing and dividing

It is important children remember to share equally.
They can draw out the sharing if they need to.

So to find... 12 shared by 3 or $12 \div 3$

They can draw 3 sharing circles and share out 12.



And then they can see that the answer is 4.

Once they are confident with this method, they can start linking division to multiplication facts that they know.

$$5 \times 2 = 10$$

$$10 \div 2 = 5$$

Wednesday	Today the focus will be on dividing into equal groups Children are to complete IXL Z.2
Thursday	Today the focus will be on relating multiplication to division Children are to complete IXL Z.6
Friday	Today the focus will be on dividing Children are to go to: Number Multiplication Y2 Dividing
