Thursday	Today the focus will be on money Children to complete the online task on mymaths - money OW

Friday	Today the focus will be on shapes Children to complete the online task on mymaths - 3D shapes OW
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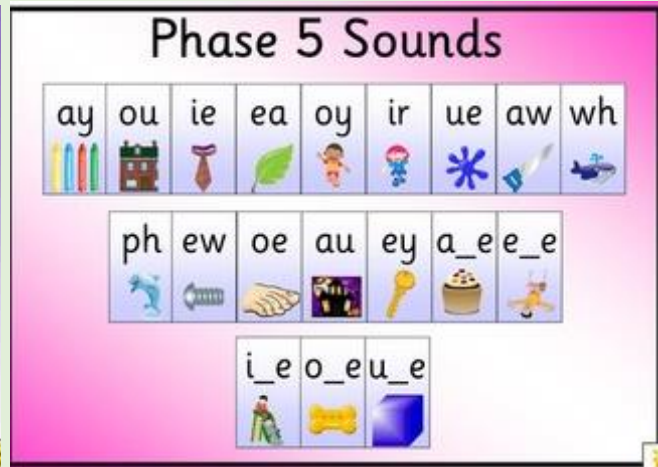
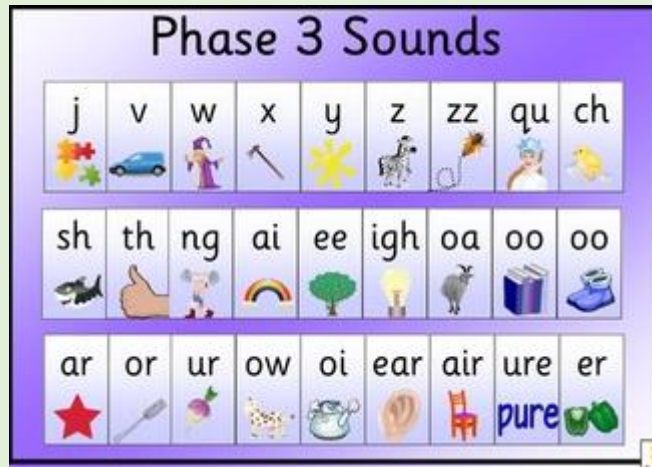
Reading

Writing	
This is our last week of writing in Year 1 so we are going to take this time to reflect and look forward to next year.	
Task 1	<p><u>To write your reflection of Year 1</u></p> <p>Give children time to reflect on all of the things that they have done in Year 1. They can then write about what their favourite part of Year 1 has been? What were they really good at? What is their favourite subject? What do they need to keep working hard on?</p>
Task 2	<p><u>To write a letter to your Year 1 teacher</u></p> <p>Today children can write a letter to Aimee. Let the children be quite free with this. Let them think of their own things that they would like to say to Aimee and think of their own questions for Aimee too.</p>
Task 3	<p><u>To write a letter to your Year 2 teacher</u></p> <p>Today the children are going to write a letter to the teacher they will have next year. What do they want to tell them? Let your new teacher know who your friends are and what you like. What questions have they got about Year 2?</p>

Phonics

- The children have now covered all of their sounds from phase 2-5.
- They will still need to practise these sounds daily, so I have attached phase 3 and 5 sound mats below.



- Your child may have difficulty with a particular sound which you might want to focus on, using the same method as we did before. Practise saying, practise writing and practise reading.

Science

This term we are learning all about plants. At home the children can do the following activities:

- Label parts of a flowering plant and tree (leaves, flowers (blossom), petals, fruit, roots, bulb, seed, trunk, branches, stem)
- Label parts of a tree
- The children should become familiar with the names of common plants
- Understand some trees are deciduous and some are evergreen
- They can plant a plant of their choice and observe how it changes over time
- Understand what a flower needs to grow
